

- To create a sequence of sentences to form a short text
- To read their writing and check it makes sense
- To read aloud their writing to others



Grammar and Punctuation


Key objectives for Year 1:

- To use capital letter, full stop, finger spaces
- To understand and begin to use question marks and exclamation marks
- To use capital letters for people, places and days of the week
- To begin to identify nouns, adjectives and verbs in sentences
- To begin to use past and present tense correctly

Spelling




- To spell most of the HFW and Y1 common exception words
- To spell words using their phonic knowledge
- To spell words ending in -s or -es correctly
- To spell days of the week




Handwriting

Key objectives for Year 1:

- To count in multiples of 2s, 5s and 10s
- Identify 1 more/less to 100

- To add and subtract numbers to 20
- To know number bonds to 20

<u>Uniform</u>




- Please ensure all children are wearing school uniform
