# English in Year 3



#### English throughout Year 3 covers the following:

- Reading
- Writing
- Grammar
- Punctuation
- Spelling
- Handwriting





## **Reading in Year 3**

Word Reading

- Applying knowledge of root words, prefixes and suffixes.
- Comprehension

-Talk about a wide range of books, fiction, poetry, plays and non-fiction.

- Predict what might happen from details stated and implied.
- Use dictionaries to check the meaning of words they have read.
- Ask relevant questions to improve their understanding of the text.
- Draw inferences such as character's feelings, thoughts and motives).
- Skilled word reading
  - -Speedy decoding of pronunciation

- Speedy recognition of familiar words



### Writing in Year 3

### **Key objectives for Year 3:**

-Demonstrate some variety of sentence structures using a range of adverbial and prepositional phrases.

-Use some direct speech within narrative writing.

-Use headings and sub-headings to aid presentation.

-Proof-read for common spelling and punctuation errors.

-Read aloud their own writing to a group or the whole class, using appropriate intonation.



### **Grammar in Year 3**

Key objectives for Year 3:

- Pupils will be taught the grammatical terminology and concepts
- Using and punctuating speech
- Indicating possession
- Correctly punctuating fronted adverbials



### **Spelling**

Key objectives for Year 3:

- Children should be able to spell common words correctly, including common exception words.
- Use the diagonal and horizontal strokes that are needed to join letters and understand letters are best left un-joined
- Increase the legibility, consistency and quality of their handwriting

Children will be sent home with weekly spellings for you to see that we have been practicing during the week.

There is also a list of the **statutory** spellings at the back of their diaries for them to learn.

## PE in Year 3

It is a statutory subject and some sessions will be taught by CV Life so that children can participate in local competitions.

## **Home learning**

#### Home learning is very important in Year 3.

Every child in the school has a diary/school planner. Parents are encouraged to write in planners and use them to communicate with their child's teacher. These planners also act as reading records and will contain weekly spellings.

Homework at Inspire comprises both compulsory and optional tasks:

- <u>Reading</u> We expect the children to read regularly at home throughout the week. For younger children, this will be to an adult, and for older children this may be on their own and then using parents to ask questions about aspects of the book they are reading. (Please record each time you have listened to your child read/ ask questions in their reading diary.) Whatever kind of text you've shared (it might even be an online article or leaflet) please do pop a note/signature in their diary. Children will also have access to the 'Reading Eggs' app.
- <u>Spellings</u> will be given out each week. Your child's reading diary will be used to record the week's spelling lists, and they
  will complete their spelling test in these diaries (at the back) so you can see how they've got on and help them with any that they
  have not managed to perfect yet.
- <u>TT Rockstars and Numbots</u> Children will be able to battle against one another in times table challenges. Each child has an individual log in.
- <u>Maths and English (recommended home learning)</u> This term we would like to continue to set home learning each week electronically. Teachers will post links onto Class Dojo suggesting an online lesson, game or activity that will consolidate their learning for that particular week. This will enable children to build, extend, apply their knowledge and support the important 'stickability' of learning.
