
Areas of Learning

The 5 Ms

At Whittle this is just the start. We have designed our own bespoke curriculum that encompasses the 7 areas of learning and the characteristics of learning in an engaging and exciting curriculum that we call **The Ms**.



How we Learn

- Our EYFS has a play-based approach to learning, tailored to meet the needs of each individual child.
- Learning is child-led and is planned around the interests of the children
- There are a mixture of adult-led and childinitiated activities

Learning Environments

- Every day we will use both the indoor and outdoor learning environments so please ensure your child is dressed appropriately for the weather.
- -Wellie boots (leave in school)
- -Warm coat, hat and gloves
- -Sun hat and sun cream
- -Spare change of clothes (leave in school)













Reading and Writing



- All our reading and writing is taught through a phonics scheme called Read Write Inc.
- Read Write Inc. encourages children to know all their single sounds first (phonemes) and then moves on to blending the sounds to support reading.
- Your child will bringing home a 'bedime book' from our library to share with you.
- Once they have learnt their sounds and are beginning to blend some simple words they will be given a reading book from our reading scheme alongside some high frequency words to take home.

- An Online Learning Journal System
- EYFS Staff record children's learning and progression usingiPads
- Parents can view their child's journal on mobile devices, tablets and on home computers at any time!
- Parents can comment on observations or even add their own!
- A password and PIN is required to access Tapestry for all users.
- Only parents can view the individual observations of their child.

Starting Nursery and Reception

What your child will need...

•Named water bottle

School Lunches

Our meals are prepared on the premises by Catering Academy. Menus are displayed on the school website and run on a three weekly cycle.

<u>Nursery:</u> If your child is entitled to the 30 hour funding they can have a hot dinner at school costing $\pounds 2.25$.

Reception: All children in Reception are





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entitled to a free hot school dinner every day.

Home visits and starting arrangments


- <u>Home visits</u> only for children NEW to Whittle this year. You will be able to arrange this today.

- Both Nursery and Reception classes will have 'staggered' starts in September. We will share these details with you.







How to help your child settle in well
